

ORDINANCE NO. 510

AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF PENN ALLEY BETWEEN MCCOLLY STREET AND AN UNOPENED 12 FOOT ALLEY

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the Council of the Borough of Ligonier, in session lawfully assembled, that the following described portion of Penn Alley be and the same is hereby vacated:

ALL THAT PORTION of Penn Alley, 12 feet in width, beginning at an iron pin on the westerly line of McColly Street at the southeasterly corner of land of Paul J. Samios and Margaret A. Wiese; thence along the westerly line of McColly Street, South 5° 40' 00" East, a distance of 12.00 feet to an iron pin at corner of lot of John D. Barr and Lisa M. Barr; thence along line of land of John D. Barr and Lisa M. Barr, South 84° 12' 00" West, a distance of 135.00 feet to an iron pin on the easterly line of an unopened 12 foot wide alley; thence along said unopened 12 foot wide alley, North 5° 48' 00" West, a distance of 12.00 feet to an iron pin at corner of land of Paul J. Samios and Margaret A. Wiese; thence along line of land of Paul J. Samios and Margaret A. Wiese, North 84° 12' 00" East, a distance of 135.00 feet to an iron pin on the westerly line of McColly Street at the place of beginning.

CONTAINING 1,620 square feet. The above description is in accordance with a survey by Ross Surveying dated August 7, 2000.

The Borough of Ligonier reserves the right to repair, maintain, remove and replace any and all existing utility lines across the above described portion of Penn Alley.

This ordinance will become effective 40 days after the enactment thereof.
